#### **College Timeline and Tips**

\*All colleges vary in requirements and how they want application materials submitted. Please be sure to read all information from the college thoroughly and communicate with Mrs. Zeigler for help with applications.

#### Be prepared!

- Take the SAT in the spring of 11th grade. If you are unhappy with your score, you can take it again in the fall of 12th grade. Do not wait until 12th grade to take it for the first time! Register online at www.collegeboard.org. Deadlines are typically 4-6 weeks prior to the test.
- Practice for the SAT. If you took the PSAT, you have online access to a personalized study guide. Check out www.khanacademy.org for free practice.
- If you are majoring in science, consider taking the ACT as well. Register at www.act.org.
- Visit colleges in the spring of 11th grade or anytime after. The sooner the better! You should have a college list ready to show your counselor at the start of school.
- Attend Financial Aid Night in August and spend some time searching for scholarships over the summer.

- Spend time this summer writing a college resume that lists your activities, sports, community service, honors/awards, and other achievements. This is helpful when asking for letters of recommendation and allows the writer to give you an awesome letter! Ask Mrs. Zeigler for a guide and sample if you'd like. Always give 2 weeks' notice when asking for a recommendation and be sure to send a thank you!
- Sign up for college visits in Flextime. These are mostly in the fall.
- Apply to college by Thanksgiving of senior year. Some colleges or selective programs may require applications even earlier!
- Mrs. Barber handles transcript requests if you need your transcript sent.
- If you want to play college sports, you must register with the NCAA during 11th grade. You'll need a certain GPA in approved courses to play. Be sure to notify your counselor of your intent to play. See www.ncaa.org for details.
- Complete the FAFSA financial aid application and PA State Grant application after October 1st of senior year.
- Apply for scholarships and remember to thank your recommenders.
